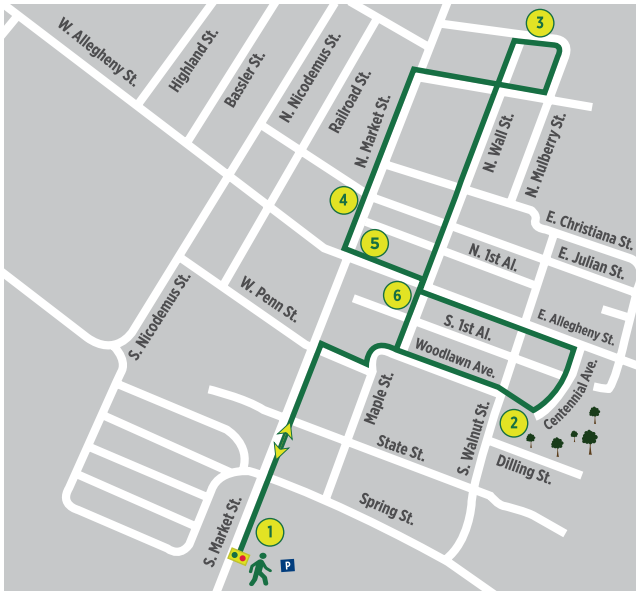

Martinsburg History & Heritage Walk

Route

- 1 Village at Morrisons Cove**

The Village, established in 1903, occupies over 100 acres and is a continuing care community offering many retirement options to individuals from independent homes to skilled nursing care.
- 2 Morrisons Cove Memorial Park**

Incorporated in 1921 and community owned, Morrisons Cove Memorial Park was dedicated to the Soldiers and Sailors of the Cove in 1934. The entranceway and monuments feature numerous historic artifacts of American war history, including stones from the Gettysburg battlefield.
- 3 Fairview Cemetery**

Fairview Cemetery was founded in 1808 and contains the resting place for people from all walks of life including Native Americans and veterans from the American Revolution to the present. A large monument marks Martinsburg Civil War Lieutenant Colonel Alexander Bobb and the cemetery contains the resting place for Brooks Brubaker Jr., the first confirmed Blair County casualty of World War II at Pearl Harbor.
- 4 Morrisons Cove Herald**

Established in 1885, the Herald is a weekly newspaper and is recognized as “The Spokesman of the Cove.” Constructed in 1842, the building is one of the oldest in Martinsburg.
- 5 Community Clock**

The Community Clock signifies the “Crossroads of the Cove.” Incorporated in 1832, Martinsburg is recognized as the oldest continuously incorporated borough in Blair County.
- 6 Hotel Wall Mural**

Gracing the side of a building that dates back to 1872, the Hotel Wall Mural is a life-size wall mural depicting the historic Teeters Hotel. Located where the parking lot stands today, the original hotel was built in 1855 and was destroyed by fire in 2000. The building currently houses Mamie’s Café and Bakery.
