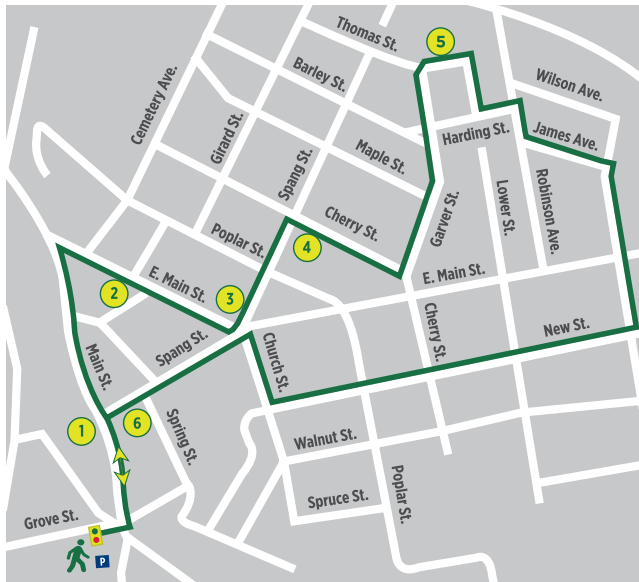


The Bare Trail Route

The Bare Trail Route

- 1 Train Station**

Starting in 1871, the Pennsylvania Railroad began its connection to Roaring Spring Borough having a significant effect on the Borough's development by drawing the paper mill and the area into the mainstream national commerce. The Roaring Spring Train Station is a restored 1906 station and is the only remaining authentic train station in Blair County.
- 2 The Eldon Inn**

Built during the summer of 1907 and costing approximately \$25,000, the Eldon Inn is a three story brick structure with all the modern conveniences available at the time. The Inn operated until 1961. The Roaring Spring Community Library moved into the structure in 1966 and remains there today.
- 3 Roaring Spring Municipal Building**

The Roaring Spring Municipal building housed the local fire company until 1976 at which time the Borough moved its operations in.
- 4 Bill Bush Park**

Established in 1975, Bill Bush Park is a children's park located in a residential neighborhood along Cherry Street. The Park contains picnic tables, playground equipment and a pavilion. The grounds and playground equipment were donated in memory of Bill Bush.
- 5 North Park**

Located in a residential neighborhood along Thomas Street, North Park has the first basketball court in Roaring Spring to have lights.
- 6 Spring Dam**

The centerpiece of Spring Dam Park is an electric fountain erected in 1937 in memory of Daniel M. Bare, founder of Roaring Spring. This beautiful setting, with a newly restored 1942 PRR N5C caboose and Blair County's only remaining train station next to it, draws residents and visitors alike. Many of the town's celebrations and special events are held here.
